Sending your iPod/iPhone to Gadget Repair

The following information is to assist you in getting the best service possible from Gadget Repair. Please take the following steps:

1. Create your account on our web site by clicking on this link (hold CTRL while clicking) : https://secure.securexsl.com/~gadgetrp/create_account.php?osCsid=68720cd70f6041d2d5c29db18a36807f . This will help us track your device and contact information. If this link doesn't work, go to www.gadgetrepair.biz, then My Account, then Continue (under the New Customer section.)
2. When creating your account on www.GadgetRepair.biz , there is a section to explain what is wrong with your device. For example, "I have a 3G iPhone with a cracked touch screen." Or, "I have a 5th Gen iPod Video, 80GB, which does not hold a charge very long" or "there is a clicking sound every time I turn it on." Any details will help us in the proper diagnosis of your device. The more details the better. If you want, please email us at Info@GadgetRepair.biz with your iPod/iPhone symptoms, problems, and issues.
3. We normally stay in contact with you via email, but sometimes a phone call makes more sense. So please make sure we have your phone number and an email address. This information can be included when creating your account at www.GadgetRepair.biz .
4. If your iPhone or iPod has a Security Code to get past the initial screen, please remove the Security Code or tell us what it is so we can check your device.
5. Back up your files using iTunes. Certain repairs may require Restoring your iPod/iPhone which erases all media/music/video files, settings, contacts, etc.
6. For iPhones, we like to have your SIM card for testing, unless you need it for your backup phone.
7. Using the US Postal Service, mail your iPod/iPhone to the following address:

UPS and FEDEX do not deliver to a P.O. Box, so use USPS. Pack your device in a box instead of an envelope and don't forget insurance. From time to time we do have someone send us their iPod/iPhone and it never arrives. This could be due to shipping to the wrong address, the package gets ruined, the destination address is not readable, the package gets lost, or any other reason. We are not responsible for lost or damaged packages.

Repair Issues with the Original 2G iPhone

The Original iPhone is also known as the 1st Generation or 2G iPhone. We will refer to it as the 2G. If your 2G needs repaired, you should be aware of the following issues:



1. The main repair with this 2G is a cracked glass panel, the one you can touch. This glass panel covers the digitizer (touch screen). When the glass panel breaks usually the digitizer (touch screen) no longer works. The problem with the glass panel and touch screen is that they are assembled as one single piece with the LCD screen (which displays the actual images). So there are actually three layers (glass panel, digitizer, and LCD.) You may have perfect images on the LCD but the touch screen doesn't function properly or the touch screen may function perfectly but the glass panel is cracked. There is no way to separate these three layers and repair only one layer. This one part always includes the glass panel, touch screen, and the LCD screen, meaning it is an expensive part to replace. Our price to replace the touch/LCD screen is \$180.00 plus shipping. By comparison, the next generation 3G iPhone is manufactured so that the glass panel and touch screen is one piece and separate from the LCD screen. The repair of the glass panel/touch screen on a 3G is about half that of the 2G iPhone because the LCD screen does not need replaced if it still works properly.
2. The next big issue with the 2G is that nice silver back cover. This cover is made from thin aluminum meaning it can bend with very little effort. If you have ever tried to remove a 2G back cover you quickly realized that it is secured really tight. Also, as you try your best to remove it, it will bend, deform, and break easily. In some cases we have to simply replace the old back cover with a new one because the old one was already deformed or damaged or because the removal process damaged the back cover. In most cases we can straighten out the back cover but it will not look 100% like it did prior to removing it. Experience definitely helps but it's almost impossible to eliminate a certain amount of minor nicks, dents, or scratches. These aluminum back covers are not cheap either. Replacing one (without the circuit that connects the headphone jack, power button, silent/mute switch, and volume button) can cost \$70 or more. Add another \$10 or \$20 to include the circuit just mentioned. In some cases the 2G owner ends up paying an additional \$70 to \$85 for a new back cover simply because removing the back cover can damage it. This is just the way it is.
3. If you have multiple problems with your 2G (let's say a broken touch screen and the Hold button doesn't work) you could easily have a repair bill that exceeds \$200, maybe reaching \$225 or \$250 or more! At that point you have to ask yourself if paying \$200 or more to repair a 2G is worth it. I always mention upgrading to a new iPhone because it could be cheaper in the long-run and you have newer technology without needing any repairs. If you are eligible for an iPhone upgrade with your cell phone carrier, you should really consider it. But if you want your trusty 2G iPhone in working order, we are happy to repair it for you.
4. We do not Unlock or Jailbreak iPhones. We stay busy enough repairing them at this time.
